- 1. Happy New Year! We hope that everyone had a restful and enjoyable Christmas break.
- 2. Class Updates:
- ELP Both the morning and afternoon Early Learning classes put on a small Christmas concert on December 15, 2022. There was a good turnout for both performances. The children were proud and excited to perform in front of their families.
- Kindergarten The Kindergarten children enjoyed participating in a variety of Christmas-themed play activities and watching the movie Polar Express together. They also enjoyed having 3 pajama days in December!
- Mrs. Maier & Ms. Wallace Both Grade 1/2 classes joined together before the Christmas break to participate in some STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) activities. A couple of the activities included building the biggest snowman and building a frozen fortress. These activities were challenging and fun!
- Mr. Huff The Grade 2/3 had a great experience with Scientists in Schools. They learned about sound through a variety of activities/experiments, including building their own instruments!
- Mrs. Snopek & Mr. Comchi The Grade 3/4 students finished writing their personal narratives and are starting their information writing projects. Both classes will be going to the Galt Museum in early February for the programs "Race for Resources" and "Blackfoot Voices."
- Mrs. Wilson The Grade 5s organized a very successful food drive using the "Reverse Advent" format. They collected 2 1/2 red bins full of food which was picked up by the Lethbridge Food Bank. They would like to thank all who contributed. Prior to starting the food drive, the Grade 5 class visited the Lethbridge Food Bank which taught them how to serve like Jesus. This project and the field trip were both meaningful and wonderful experiences for the students. On January 19th, 2023, the Grade 5s will be taking a virtual field trip to the Canadian Museum of History. They will also be participating in a virtual presentation by Scientists in Schools on January 26th focusing on circuits and electricity.
- Ms. Boras The Grade 6 students will be participating in "The Great Canadian Mail Race." This involves each student writing a letter to any other Grade 6 class in Canada. The first class to receive a reply wins the race!
- 3. Special Events/Activities:
- Mrs. Scott-Perry and all staff would like to say a big thank-you to all who came out to the Christmas concert. Both performances were well attended.
- Mrs. MacIntosh's Kindergarten class had entered the City of Lethbridge's snow plow naming contest and some of their suggestions won! The winning entries were: CAPTAIN FLURRY, SUPER KOONSKOYI (goons-goy means snow in Blackfoot), MEAN JEAN THE SNOWPLOW MACHINE, and WOW THE PLOW. On Friday, January 13, 2023, Mayor Hyggen, Councillor Schmidt-Rempel and some members of the Transportation Department, along with "Mean Jean the Snow Plow Machine," came to visit our school. The Transportation Department explained the parts of the snow plow and what it does. They also gave a demonstration of how it works.
- The big reveal for our "Read with Us" book study was on Monday, January 16, 2023 during a whole school assembly. Students watched a video about the animals and life in the Arctic. They also got a

special treat! Excitement and anticipation for the book study was created by the revealing of clues the week before. The students had fun making predictions of what they thought the book will be. Each student in the school received a copy of the book "The Very, Very Far North" by Dan Bar-el, along with a reading guide, to take home. Families are encouraged to find time to read the book together at home. At school, students can submit answers to trivia questions to win prizes and a variety of activities related to the book will be provided to the teachers to choose from to do in class.

- Both the boys and girls' basketball teams have started practicing! The girls' team will be practicing Mondays and Wednesdays after school, while the boys will be practicing Tuesdays and Thursdays after school. Both teams will play games against other Holy Catholic Schools. Thank-you to Ms. Boras, Mrs. Collier, Mr. Comchi, and Ms. Wallace for coaching these teams and providing this wonderful experience for the students.
- Our school will once again be participating in the Blankets of Hope program this February. This is the 5th year in a row that we are getting 250 free blankets. We will have a letter writing day (date to be announced) where all children will participate in writing a note of kindness to attach to one of the blankets. The blankets will then be given to Streets Alive to be distributed to people in need in our community.
