#### **Spaces Assessment Learning Platform:**

The reporting tool that will be used this school year is called SPACES. Spaces is an interactive assessment app. that allows students to capture their learning and reflect on growth, anytime and anywhere. Spaces will give parents a window into their child's classroom as well as their learning journey. As our staff and students are new to this platform, we will all be learning to make the most of this communication and

reporting tool throughout the year. Parent engagement will be very important to ensure success with Spaces at our school. This online platform will be opened up to parents by the start of November. In this platform, samples of student work and ongoing communication with parents will be used while reporting student learning outcomes. Paper copies of progress reports will not be given out in November, March, and June. Instead, the opportunity for parents to be part of the ongoing learning of their child will be offered through this online portal and parents will receive an invite from their child's teacher.

- 1. Classroom Updates: All classes have been busy establishing routines, building community, and learning. Here are some highlights:
- Kindergarten The children in Mrs. Cormican's Kindergarten are enjoying exploring the school grounds, as well as the surrounding area, with their Discovery Wagon and during their Wednesday Walks. Both Kindergarten classes have a "Spectacular Science" in-class presentation booked through Destination Exploration (University of Lethbridge) on November 17, 2022.
- 1/2 Wallace Miss Wallace is using a new phonics program (developed by Tara West) with her students and they have been experiencing great success as growing readers.
- 1/2 Maier The students in Mrs. Maier's class are having fun exploring building structures with different types of materials in their Science classes.
- 2/3 Huff The students in Mr. Huff's class are learning the value of coins in Math and learning about the Earth in Science.
- 3/4 Snopek & Comchi- The students in these two classes made crystals in Science. They experienced great success and Mrs. Snopek says that these were the best crystals that she has seen made in her class.
- Grade 5 Mrs. Wilson and the Grade 5 students are looking forward to their virtual field trip to The Bank of Canada Museum in Ottawa on October 19. This fits in with the money and budgeting learner outcomes in the new Wellness curriculum.
- Grade 6 Miss Boras and the Grade 6 students have been spending time over at Nicholas Sheran Park for their Trees & Forest unit in Science. Miss Boras has tentatively booked the Grade 6 outdoor camp for May 29-31, 2023 at SABC.

# 2. Special Events/Activities:

- We had a "gobbling" good time during our Turkey Trot around Nicholas Sheran on the Friday before Thanksgiving. Staff and students gathered in their colour teams to walk/run around the lake wearing turkey hats and gobbling. This was a fun way to show gratitude for all that we have and a wonderful opportunity to gather as a school community before the long weekend.
- The Christmas Committee has met and started planning the Christmas concert, which is scheduled for December 7, 2022.
- The Read with Us committee is in the process of finalizing the book choice for this year. They would like to ask the School Council for a donation of \$500 to contribute towards the purchasing of books. This would be added to the money raised through the Old Dutch Chip fundraiser.

- Old Dutch Chip orders will be available for pick-up on Friday, October 21, 2022.
- The volleyball teams have started practicing! They will be alternating between lunchtime and afterschool practices. Thank-you to Mrs. Clamp and Mr. Comchi for coaching the students. The CSM volleyball teams will be participating in Volleyball Jamborees on October 21, 2022 and November 18, 2022.
- On Monday, October 31, 2022 we will have our "Dress-Up for Halloween" day! There will also be Faith-in-Action assembly that day.

<u>Faith Theme.</u> This year is the start of a new three-year Faith Theme. Arise! Pilgrims of Hope. The title for this year is Arise! and the Faith Focus is God is in Our Hearts. We will focus on looking inward as we grow in faith and learn about the Spiritual Works of Mercy and the Fruits of the Spirit. The full Faith Theme and faith inventory will be presented at a future school council meeting.

<u>Sacraments.</u> Zachary needed to postpone his time at the school in September and we are hoping to reschedule soon and find out more about Sacramental preparation, including school retreats - and how the school could support or be involved. The first reconciliation courses have started already, and confirmation will be starting in November.

<u>Religious Education.</u> The school will continue using the Growing in Faith Growing in Christ resource for all Religious Education grades 1 to 6. The Fully Alive resource à Catholic approved resource for teaching Health will also now be fully implemented for grades 1 to 6.

<u>Friday Gospel.</u> Each Friday the students will gather in the gym first thing after the bell and until 9:15. During this time we read and discuss the upcoming Sunday Gospel to help students be prepared to hear the Gospel and maybe even find the message in the Homily at mass. We also learn about parts of the mass, common prayers, dive deeper into our Faith Theme, talk about our Faith in Action themes and discuss things we are grateful for. We are thankful to spend this time as a community.
